Lesson: 3-D Lettering (one-point perspective*)

Instructions: Write your name in one-point perspective and color in your design.

Vocabulary:

1-point perspective
Vanishing point

Horizon line
Diagonal line

Questions: What is one point perspective?

How do the letters look different from one another depending on how close they are to the vanishing point?

What else would you like to learn how to draw in perspective?

Can there be more than one vanishing point?

One point perspective is a drawing method that shows how things appear to get smaller as they get further away, converging towards a single 'vanishing point' on the horizon line. It is a way of drawing objects upon a flat piece of paper (or other drawing surface) so that they look three-dimensional and realistic.

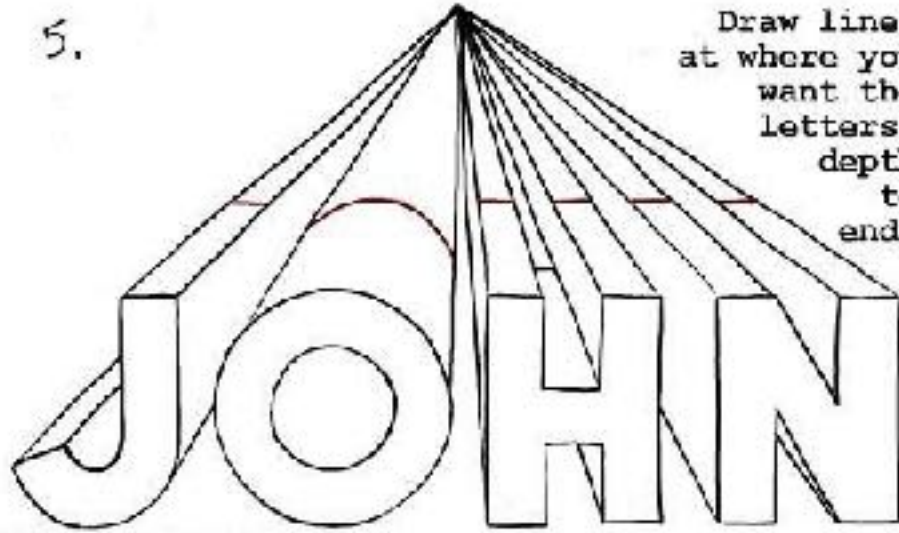

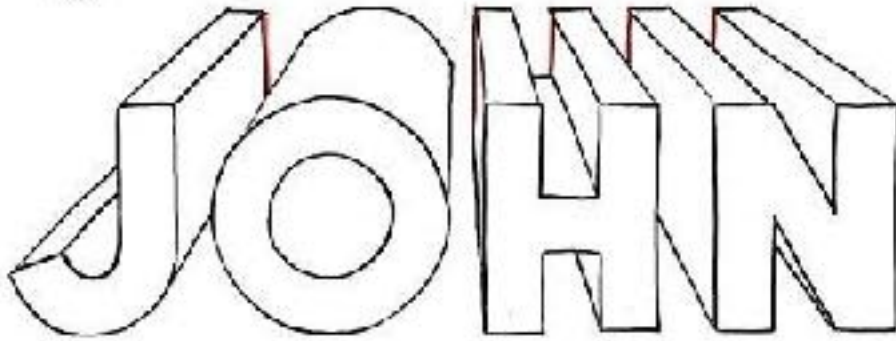

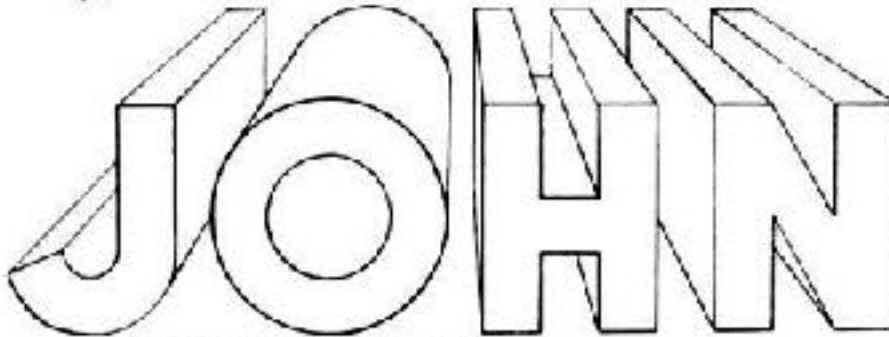
